## International cuttings

To be able to guarantee a continued delivery of high-quality plant starting material from cuttings, we have three mother stock locations in Kenya, Ethiopia and Portugal. In these countries with a total of 30 ha, certified cuttings are produced in special production greenhouses, which are submitted to rigorous regular inspection.

All cuttings supplied by the various locations are checked thoroughly immediately after arriving at the young plant production site in Hendrik-Ido-Ambacht, the Netherlands. The cuttings need to be fresh, uniform and healthy. Only the best quality cuttings can produce high-quality healthy young plants.

## Renewed URC logistics

Last season we adopted new measures in order to optimise the quality of our unrooted cuttings and the reliability of our deliveries. These steps have resulted in an improvement of the packaging, the labels and the air freight handling.

We have developed a solid cardboard box that regulates humidity, releases ethylene, isolates and has good re-cooling properties. The inner packaging consists of 4 solid boxes in handy dimensions and is based upon standard quantities. This gives extra protection and individual ice/gelpacks are easy to insert.

Also the labelling is improved and has resulted in uniform and clear labels providing all basic information in text and via a barcode. The boxes are fully traceable and suitable for cross docking.

Through our cooperation with another partner we have the access to a pro-active information stream, a better process control and improved cool chain facilities.

These perennials grow up to approx. 120 to 140 cm tall and when fully developed. Echinacea purpurea is called "purple cone flower" because the original forms usually have pinkish-purple flowers. Over the last decades, many varieties with new colours and cultivars have been developed. Each series below sets new standards in its class.

A series that sets new standards. # Euphorbia amygdaloides

## Woodspurge

## **Euphorbia griffithii**

### Griffith's spurge

A strongly coloured species for moist positions rich in nutrients. A spectacular eye-catcher in the garden because of its bright orange red foliage and flowers. Also a very attractive addition to the Autumn perennial assortment. Gorgeous Autumn colours.

## **Euphorbia myrsinites**

## Geum chiloense

### Chilean avens

## **Lychnis chalcedonica** Maltese Cross

The wild form is variable from 20 to 90 cm tall. This species has declined in numbers because of modern farming techniques and draining of wet-lands and is no longer common. ## **Lychnis viscaria** Sticky Catchfly

In May-June, a wealth of panicles with bright red flowers appear above the graceful, narrow leaves of the Sticky Catchfly. This perennial flowers after vernalization and is suitable for sale to a limited extent as a flowering plant in approx 3-litre pot. Container perennial after it is vernalized.

## **Lychnis x arkwrightii** Camion; Catchfly



## Macleaya cordata

### Plume Poppy

Originating from China this plant is also at home in Europe and North-America. This perennial grows up to 250 cm tall and provides special accents in the garden with its bluish green, deeply cut fig-like leaves. This cut foliage plant needs some space for showing its full splendour. The white "Feathery flowers" are rather inconspicuous and appear in the second year of cultivation. ## Penstemon hartwegii



When grown as annuals, one should plant several young plants per pot and cut these back once or twice.

The Phlox Flame series combines all features required for a professional perennial cultivation in 3 to 5 litre containers. Healthy deep green, dense foliage is topped with large flower clusters. ## Phlox amoena

### Phlox

Phlox amoena is a medium tall carpet-forming phlox that grows up to about 20 cm tall. In warm, loose soils deficient in lime the carmine flowers appear from April onwards.

## Physalis alkekengi

### Chinese Lantern; Winter Cherry

The Chinese Lantern is mainly known as a dried flower. Together with their stems, the orange red lantern shaped fruit coverings are often used in decorations. However, physalis is also usable as a container perennial for late Summer sales. The flowers are inconspicuous and white. Later on, the flower calyx develops into an involucre that starts out green and then changes colour to orange red and encloses an approx. 10 mm large orange berry. In annual cultivation the plants will grow up to a maximum of 40 cm in height. Until the end of cultivation the plants should be fertilized amply, otherwise they will wither prematurely.

**Franchetii:** Use as garden perennial in 9 cm pots.

**Gnome:** Dwarf variety for pots and containers.

## Physostegia virginiana

### Obedient Plant

Very long lasting, easy to care for and sometimes vigorous labiate plant. The common name comes from the fact that the flowers can swivel and bend to the left or right making it look as if the plant obeys something or someone. The "Obedient Plant" is a pleasant garden or border plant that, depending on the variety, flowers with bright lilac or white spikes that are produced from mid Summer until early Autumn and are good cut flowers. A few new breeding products flower first year from seed and are suitable as container perennials for sale in late Summer.

This native perennial is attractive even for just its feathery leaves. The plants form splendid clumps with upright, long, fragrant blue or white flower spikes. In addition to the garden varieties, some are also suitable for pot perennial production.

# Potentilla

## Cinquefoil

"Cinquefoil" catches the eye because of its strawberry-like foliage and flowers that are reminiscent of strawberries. It gets its name from the shape of its leaves that are divided into five parts, like small hands. The species vary in height, depending on variety between 15 and 40 cm. The usually single flowers appear from early June until August in shades of red, orange or yellow. Potentilla is fully hardy and also easy to grow and relatively undemanding. The plants are very suitable for natural types of garden but also good ground covering plants in herbaceous borders.

# Primula

## Primula denticulata Drumstick Primrose

The characteristic spherical flower heads are composed of many individual flowers. The plants are excellent for inclusion in wild herbaceous borders but also for flowerbeds. Next to primula acaulis, primula denticulata have long since been a staple in the Spring assortment. When grown in the field in Spring, the plants can be forced into flowering in January or left to flower the natural way and marketed. Use as garden perennial in 9 cm pot.







# Scabiosa Sempervivum

## Scabiosa caucasica Perfecta Caucasian pincushion flower

The large flowers develop at the end of long wiry stems that make Scabiosa into excellent cut flowers. ## Sedum

Sedum is a plant genus with many different species. All these species are leaf succulents that are true artists as far as water retaining qualities are concerned. In this way sedum takes up a special position and can be used in many different ways. Apart from extremely dry positions in the garden, many species are also extremely suitable as green roof perennials. Many first season flowering sedums can also be used to get through the very difficult warm Summer months, when there is not much else that is saleable. The assortment below is divided into four groups.

- 1 Large-leaved, flowering varieties for solitaire pots from 13 to 19 cm.





## Tellima grandiflora

### Fringecups

## Tiarella wherryi

### Foamflower

## Thymus vulgaris

**Thymus vulgaris Compactus:** White. This vegetative compact form is suitable for cultivation in pots because of its high degree of uniformity and even flower reaction.

## Thymus citriodorus

### Lemon Thyme

Originating from the South of France, this is a sun loving thyme. Fragrance of thyme and lemons, "Lemon Thyme" exists in many foliage colours, which make these into popular perennials for Autumn planting. The very hardy plants will contain their structure and form for a long time in pots and tubs. Several varieties also prove to be good ground covering plants in gaps between stepping stones and steps.

### Common Valerian

This species is also one of the few herbs native to Central Europe. In wet positions, the roots develop their aromatic calming essence. A very large perennial with attractive leaves for sale during the planting season.

## Grasses

The beauty of many grasses does not always reveal itself immediately; nevertheless, ornamental grasses are becoming increasingly popular. Many grasses are useful for adding structure to mixed perennial plantings, as a colourful addition to annual Summer flowering bedding plants and in the Autumn assortment. The species that we offer are easy to grow and will appeal to the consumer because of their very good shelf life and because they cost little or nothing to maintain.

### ***Ammophila arenaria***

European Marram Grass, European Beach grass, Dune grass

A very tall tuft forming grass with bluish green overhanging leaves. Beach grass grows in sandy, well-draining soils, where they grow few runners. The creamy yellow flower spikes appear from September. On the coast, on islands or in sandy areas, this species is often used for binding dunes and other sands.

### ***Anemanthele lessoniana* Sirocco**

A grass with fantastic colour shades in copper, pink and green. These colours are best during the warm Summer months. The plants can give a beautiful structure within all mixed Summer plantings. Excellent in Summer or late Summer container production.

### ***Bouteloua gracilis***

Bleu Grama, Mosquito Grass

Low growing, tuft forming grass with brownish green, hairy leaves. The interesting dark flower spikes are combshaped and held at right angles. A field of these plants gives the impression of a swarm of mosquitoes hovering above grass. Hence the name mosquito grass.

# Grasses

## Carex pseudocyperus

?????

This sedge often grows with its feet in the water and can reach up to 1 metre tall. It is a rather loose looking sedge with a pendulous habit when in flower. False Bristly Sedge actively grows during the Spring and fall when soil temperatures are cool.

## Chasmanthium latifolium

This species is reminiscent of bamboo. This large hardy plant is only suitable for planting in the shade. It is a very attractive botanical species with very fine inflorescences. In the first year of cultivation the plants remain relatively small and are suitable for growing in pots. Only grows to its full size after some years in the garden.

## Carex testacea

### Orange New Zealand Sedge

Straight upright growing grass. In late Summer and Autumn, this copper-coloured grass provides shiny colour accents in hues of orange and green.

## Corynephorus canescens

### Grey Hair Grass

A fine, silvery blue, short but very fast growing grass. This elegant plant is native to Central Europe and only grows in very dry or well-draining areas. This plant really does not like moisture. In wet, not properly draining positions this species is not hardy. Especially beautiful in rockeries, on roofs but also as plant in 9 cm pot for Autumnal arrangements.

## Cortaderia selloana

### Pampas grass

This grass is commonly known as common cotton grass. It is often found on peat or acidic soil and in open wetland or moorland. The small, unremarkable brown and green flowers in April, develop to white bristle-like seed-heads that resemble tufts of cotton.

### Tiger Grass; Chinese Silver Grass

Miscanthus is one of the very tall grasses that are especially suitable as a specimen plant. The type from seed as offered here is somewhat variable but stands out because of its habit with very fine blades. In early Autumn, it flowers with early reddish brown spikes.

Known as a common reed and grows in water or swamps. It is used in larger garden pots, and for manufacturing roofs. In the last decade it has become important for biological water cleaning systems.
